

- 1. Please read the Syllabus and all General Rules.
- To be eligible for a money award, a competitor, in addition to receiving the adjudicator's recommendation, must have performed at least 3 solo classes (excluding Studies); the fourth requirement may be another competitive solo, Studies, Sight Reading, Composition or an ensemble piece.
- 3. Late deadline is 10pm, January 24, 2025 accompanied by \$25 penalty fee.
- 4. During the Kiwanis Music Festival Windsor-Essex County, once an entrant is offered a recommendation to Provincial Competition by phone and email, that recommendation becomes null and void if it is not accepted within 24 hours after the offer is made by phone and email.
- 5. Competitors hoping for recommendation to the Provincial Competition must comply with regulations pertaining to Provincial and Local Festivals. For provincial information and syllabus, visit www.omfa.ca or contact Mary Jeanne Peters at <u>kiwanismj@gmail.com</u> at the time of entries or before. In order for a solo performer to earn a provincial recommendation from the Kiwanis Music Festival Windsor-Essex County adjudicator, the registrant must have competed locally in a minimum of three (3) solo classes and achieved a minimum mark of **85 in each** of the three.
- 6. Open Classes to be eligible, a competitor must be studying at the ARCT level. Age is not a requirement for these classes but level of study is.

Specific to Piano

- If entering Piano Concerto classes with the goal of being recommended to the provincial level of competition, please read the provincial syllabus prior to selecting your concerto and registering for the local festival. <u>www.omfa.ca</u>
- Piano compositions identified as Studies by either the Canadian Conservatory or the Royal Conservatory of Music are NOT permitted in classes other than classes specifically for Studies.
- Note the change in the Concerto classes for ages 6-8.
- Note the addition in Piano Trios.
- Competitors hoping for a recommendation to the provincial level with a Popular Selection from either CC Contemporary Idioms or RCM Popular Selections Lists must enter P1200 - Popular Piano – Provincial Qualifying Class. Entries in either P1000 or P2700 Studies are no longer eligible for provincial recommendation.
